- Determine the extent to which training of RI personnel has improved capacities at different levels of service delivery;
- Evaluate the current capacities for cold chain management at state, LGA and health facility levels;
- Assess the data demand and use at various levels of service delivery points for routine immunization programming;
- Assess the extent to which strengthening of routine immunization(RI), and technical working groups (TWGs) has improved state ownership, institutionalization, and functionality of the TWGs; and,
- Assess the adequacy of local routine immunization planning and funding for the sustainability of routine immunization interventions
